## June 2023 Outcomes Report

## Context

Stephenson Studio School offers a high-quality vocationally focused education for students in Years 10 and 11. Situated in Stephenson College it is able to access through its service level agreement, the industry-standard workshops and industry trained staff to deliver vocational course in hair dressing, construction, motor vehicle and health and social care. The school also offers a curriculum of English language and literature, mathematics, science double award and business BTEC for students for whom this is appropriate. Work experience and work skills are also a central thread of the curriculum offer.

The school does not offer the English Baccalaureate.

## Cohort Context

Approximately 20\% of students who apply for a place at Stephenson Studio School are not in education, or have spent a considerable period out of education prior to starting Year 10.

The 2023 cohort was characterised by high levels of need:
There were 43 pupils in the Y11 cohort.

Turbulence for this cohort was $12 \%$, which was lower than last year's cohort (which stood at an historic high of $28 \%$ ). Ofsted report on turbulence concludes: 'secondary schools with high mobility levels do tend to have lower results: almost all schools with mobility above $15 \%$ have average GCSE scores below the national average.'

3 students in Y11 (7\%) came to Stephenson Studio School mid-term as 'managed moves'. They were all previous non-attenders prior to joining us.

## Progress against starting points

Students made overall good progress against starting points.
In English students were base-line assessed at the start of Year 10. Students made good progress in English. Students averaged a progress of 1 grade in English over Years 10 and 11.

In Maths students achieved on average .5 of a grade's progress against their baseline assessment grades.
